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## Introduction and Purpose

The data within this report are from the latest available as of May 2018. It compares the Area Council with Barnsley and that of England where possible.


This information is intended to support Area Councils to identify some of their strategic priorities and commission services to meet these challenges.


## **Overall Population**



Barnsley's population has been growing constantly since 2001. Since the 2011 Census, the resident population of Penistone has increased by 7.3%, whereas across Barnsley there was a 4.9% increase. These increases were mainly due to more births than deaths and international migration.



## Age Profile and % of Total Population




In 2011, less than 1 in every 100 penistone residents' main language was not English.


Barnsley's ethnic diversity continues to change. In 2011, in Penistone 3 in every 100 people were from a Black and Minority Ethnic (BME) group compared to 4 in every 100 across Barnsley.

### Proportion of Penistone Lower Super Output Areas (LSOAs) in 10% Most Deprived in England


LSOAs in 10% Most Deprived in England LSOAs not in 10% Most Deprived in England




None of the LSOAs in Penistone East and Penistone West were in the 10% most deprived in England for both IMD 2010 and IMD 2015.

### The Seven Domains of Deprivation and how Penistone Performs


### Percentage of Penistone area LSOAs in the Bottom 10% in England by Domain



**Index of Multiple Deprivation 2015 Penistone Area council LSOAs Relative to England** 



## % of Pupils Achieving a Good Level of Development 2013 - 2018






The percentage of pupils resident in the Penistone area achieving a good level of development decreased in 2018 although outcomes remained above the Barnsley average and just below the national average.


The percentage of pupils resident in the Penistone area achieving the expected standard in 2018 decreased although outcomes remained above both the Barnsley and national averages.




% of Key Stage 1 Pupils Achieving the Expected Standard 2016 - 2018

## % of Key Stage 2 Pupils Achieving the Expected Standard in Reading, Writing and Maths Combined 2016 - 2018




## % of Pupils with Special Educational Needs and Disabilities 2018







## Life Expectancy at Birth











### Rate per 1,000 Population Aged 15-17 Years





The Penistone area's under 75 cancer mortality rates have been consistently lower than the rates in Barnsley during the period 2010-2012 to 2015-2017. The current rate of 101.7 per 100,000 is the lowest during the period.







## **Excess weight**








## Smoking

The proportion of adults in the Penistone area who smoke has been consistently lower than the overall Barnsley rate at each time point during the period 2013 to 2016. The current rate of 14.1% is the lowest since 2013.


### **Related Deaths per 100,000 (Over 35's)**



The Penistone area's smoking related deaths rates have been consistently lower than the Barnsley rates since 2011-2013. However, the current rate of 201.4 per 100,000 aged 35+ is the second highest during the period 2011-2013 to 2014-2016.

## **Residents Living Alone and Aged 65+ Years**




The 2011 Census showed that 13.3% of the residents in Penistone aged 65+ lived alone and could be at risk of social isolation. Rates are similar to those levels across Barnsley and nationally.





In 2011, the proportion of all properties that were privately rented in Penistone was significantly lower than the overall rate in Barnsley and national rate.





### Crime (rate per 1,000 population)








There has been a continual notable reduction in the rate of Anti Social Behaviour (ASB) in Barnsley, changes in crime recording practices implemented by South Yorkshire Police in October 2016 have steadily reduced the number of ASB incidents. Offences that would have previously been recorded as ASB are now recorded as criminal offences where applicable.


The ASB rate for Penistone area is half the overall rate for Barnsley and lower than the national rate.

**Barnsley Internet Speed** 







## **Excess Winter Deaths Index**




The Penistone area's Excess Winter Deaths rate is lower than both the Barnsley and England rates.


