

SOUTH YORKSHIRE LIEUTENANCY

Representing His Majesty King Charles III in the County

The main duties of the Lord-Lieutenant are:

- Arranging visits by members of the Royal Family and escorting Royal visitors as appropriate.
- To actively promote South Yorkshire to help make it a better place for all who live and work here.
- Presentation of honours, medals and awards on behalf of His Majesty.
- Supporting the Armed Forces in South Yorkshire, with particular support to the Volunteer Reserves and tri-service Cadet Forces.
- Support to charities and other voluntary organisations.
- Representing The King at a wide range of events including duties with the armed forces and cadets, emergency services, places of worship, the universities, civic engagements, businesses, charities and the arts.

Representing the Monarch at relevant events such as:

Remembrance Sunday
Citizenship Ceremonies
Civic Engagements

Promoting Organisational Awards:

The Kings Award for Voluntary Service
The Kings Award for Enterprise
Assessing applications and making recommendations
Presenting the awards

Promoting Individual Honours:

Identifying prospective recipients
Prompting the submission of nominations
Assisting with the presentation of evidence
Validating public nominations received by the Cabinet Office
Making nominations for individuals to attend Royal Garden Parties

Royal Visits:

Identifying organisations for potential Royal visits
Working with the Royal Households on itineraries
Working with and supporting venue hosts on itineraries, protocols and administration
Accompanying members of the Royal Family on visits

The role of the Lord-Lieutenant is entirely non-political and the appointment carries no pay.
